- Develop and grow lay leadership to guide these and other ministries that will lead to increased fruitfulness,
- \$\Psi\$ Engaging disciples in hands-on local mission and mission trips outside of the community,
- Increasing the giving of disciples to mission including 100% support of our United Methodist commitment to world service and shared ministries, as well as giving attention to raising sufficient funds for salary and benefits, and ongoing congregation ministry as well as community/world mission.

This is a critical time for guiding this congregation in visioning a renewed direction for the church's ministry that reflects the local context and mission opportunity in Spotswood. It is also a time to develop with congregational leaders some specific plans for radical hospitality that invites and welcomes new persons into the life of the congregation.

As you begin this new phase of your ministry, know that the cabinet and I are in prayer for you, and we look forward to journeying with you: supporting, encouraging, and equipping you for vital ministry.
